Pastor Alexander Mielke

Dear Members and Friends of Martin Luther Church!

You see one of our presents from Germany in the photo, which shows Christophorus with the Christ Child on his shoulder, which carries the globe. This stone statue stands on a bridge over the Wörnitz, the river near Nördlingen, where we lived for the last 8 ½ years. Also our new congregation, the Martin Luther Church, is situated on the water. Just as the places of our vicarship, Sommer- and Winterhausen, which were located near Würzburg on the Main River, where a footpath of only 5 minutes connected the churches of these beautiful wine estate villages. As my Massai-Congregation in Tanzania on the Pangani River, where sometimes half of my 15 Church Service Stations were flooded. As Wechingen and Holzkirchen, two congregations in the deaconry of Oettingen (diocese Augsburg), where we could go canoeing on the Wörnitz with the confirmands sometimes. And now we resume our office at the Martin Luther Church on the shores of the enormous Lake Ontario.

Christophorus' task was to help people cross a large body of water. You probably know the legend of this strong and fierce giant. Because he was so strong, he feared no one and was only willing to serve the mightiest ruler of the world. Therefore, he left the king whom he had served at first. Therefore, he did not stay with a terrible black knight. Therefore, he was not even satisfied with the devil, for he fearfully avoided the cross at the wayside. After a long unsuccessful search he was ready to give up and accepted the job of carrying people across a wide and dangerous river.

One night, he heard a child's voice calling. As he climbed down into the water with the child on his shoulder, the burden grew heavier and heavier, so unbearably heavy, as if the whole world were lying on his shoulder. He sank down into the water and was

afraid to drown. Then the child said to him: "You have been given to carry more than the world. The Lord, who created the world, is your burden." Then the Child Jesus pushed him under the water and baptized him. Since then, his name was "Christophorus – Bearer of Christ".

Now he had found the mightiest ruler. He seemed to be only a small, weak child. But also the devil feared him. And this child carried the entire world in his hand; therefore, it was so tremendously heavy. This Medieval legend contains a great truth. Jesus and his message are often underestimated. His message of love and mercy is often ridiculed; his gentle and non-violent actions for people are viewed as being weak. And yet, God's love is more powerful than all the hate and all the power, which torment and suppress our world. Our great

hope is that God's kingdom will, at the end of time, prevail and benefit all creation. As the resurrected Christ says in Matthew 28, 18-20: "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you; and lo, I am with you always, to the close of the age."

I find it nice that the Christophorus, whom we often saw on the Wörnitz Bridge, now accompanies us across the great ocean. His name points to his task: "Christophorus – Bearer of Christ". And with this, he also

points to our task. Every one of us is appointed to be a "Bearer of Christ". To bear Christ in one's heart, to let our entire life be determined by this centre. And to bear the burden of Christ on our shoulders, by supporting our



neighbour and by assisting him with his burden. Martin Luther says that Christian community consists of "one person becoming Christ to the other". That we have Christ in our heart and help carry the other's burden, and thus let one another experience Christ's love.

This is the basis of all congregational work. This we wish each other for the togetherness in the Martin Luther Congregation and for this we ourselves are prepared, as far as it is possible in all human inadequacy. We have

felt some of that supporting love of Christ from so many congregational members, who assisted us in the many questions and problems of the new beginning, and for this we wish to express our heartfelt thanks as the new Pastor-Family. Let us be encouraged by Matthew 28 to be "Christ Bearers", to carry his love to all people everywhere in this world!

Concert of German Songs on Sunday Sept 23

On Sunday, September 23rd at 6:00 p.m. in our church, a choir from Rotenburg an der Wümme (near Bremen), Germany, will perform together with the Edelweiss Choir and Schola Cantorum. Director Manfred Petz from the Edelweiss Choir and Schola Cantorum has thankfully arranged this concert and gives us the following information:

"The director of the 'Canada Tournee Choir' is Rene Clair. He has assembled this choir for this Canadian concert tour from various different choirs which he leads in Germany.

The touring group consists of over 50 people, more than 30 of those are singers, the others are accompanying them. They will arrive in Toronto on September 22nd and will be accommodated in the Days Inn in Mississauga. On Tuesday, September 25th, they will go on to Ottawa, where they will sing on Thursday, September 27th at 12 o'clock in the Rotunda of the Parliament Buildings. September 29th to October 2nd, they will spend on the Niagara Peninsula, where they will give a concert in the German Seniors Home Heidehof in St. Catharines.

Following this, they fly back to Germany from Toronto. Their repertoire includes sacred songs as well as German and English folksongs. They will be happy if there would be some voluntary donations for the choir from the visitors to cover expenses of traveling costs. I am certain that your congregation will enjoy the concert and will perhaps offer some people the opportunity to resume contact with the old homeland."

In the container from Germany we brought with us the 30 German Evangelical song books with larger print which had been ordered by the congregation. Hopefully these larger letter song books will be helpful are for congregational members who have difficulties reading small letters.
