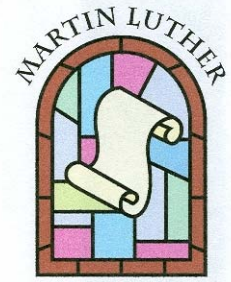

## DEVOTION

---

*Dear Members and Friends of the Martin Luther Church!*

Some time ago we were meeting in a circle of pastors and discussing "What builds a Congregation?" The basic situation mostly is the same: a decreasing number of members and a big difficulty to find new ones who are willing to continually devote themselves to the congregational life. "How can we bear witness to and live the Gospel today, in a way people understand and are attracted by it? What builds a Congregation?"

I found an old Jewish story which I'd like to share with you. At the dispersion of the Jews, the "three pillars" of Judaism, "Torah" (Holy Scripture), "Avodah" (Worship), and "Gemilus Hasadim" (Kind Deeds) came before God and cried that they would now be forgotten. 'No', said God, 'I am going to tell the believers to build synagogues, houses of God, wherever they go. The rabbi will teach the Holy Scripture, and the cantor will lead the worship.' 'What about me', asked "Kind Deeds". 'Ah', said the Lord, 'during the service each believer will turn to his neighbour and offer him a pinch from his snuffbox.'

It's an amusing little story, and at first sight it may be surprising that this tiny bit of snuff could perform such a miracle. But let us understand it as an amiable hint. The thoughtfulness and helpfulness of one for another is the secret of a

well developing congregation. It is so mundane and inconspicuous. Whenever we come together for worship, let us be thoughtful of others, be interested in their joys and sorrows. Let us greet those who are new and cordially welcome them. Let us share the good we have with others

"Let all things be done for building up", Paul says in 1 Corinthians 14:26. Let us always consider what helps for building up the congregation, for building up others. Let us not only stick to our own ideas and wishes, but let us be open for others and serve the community.



And let us celebrate the secret of Christ's great love. Right in the previous chapter, Paul praises Christ's love. We could read 1 Corinthians 13 as a catalogue of Christian virtues. But more than that, it bears witness to what God in Christ is and does for us.

"Love is patient; love is kind; love is not envious or boastful or arrogant or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; it does not rejoice in wrongdoing, but rejoices in the truth. It bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things." Each of us lives from the Love and Compassion of our Lord, each and every day. So this Bible verse invites us to let this Love of Christ touch and transform us. And so Congregation is being built.

Meetings will be on Feb 13 & 27, March 13 & 27 (and then basically every second Sunday).*
