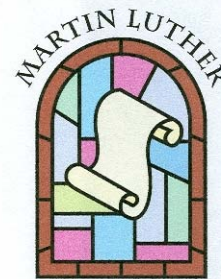

DEVOTION

Dear Members and Friends of the Martin Luther Church!

What do I believe? And how is my faith related to what has been the belief of Christianity over many centuries? These were the questions our confirmands and other youth were asking during the Confirmands' Retreat in Camp Edgewood which had been prepared together with our curate Katarina Prosenjak as well as Tanya Zielke and Marlena Mueller.

Six confirmands will celebrate their confirmation on Pentecost Sunday. And here, in a solemn act, these youth will profess the Creed together with congregation. But is this Creed still meaningful for the youth? After we had studied the Apostels' Creed for a while, we invited the confirmands to write down in their own words what they believe. And we were amazed about these texts.

There were statements of confidence like this: "God watches over us, in our time of need. Jesus helped us to believe that he can guide and empower us." There were statements following the threefold structure of the Creed. "I believe in God who helps us carry our heavy burdens and sorrows. I believe in Jesus Christ who sacrificed himself to expel our sin. I believe the holy spirit teaches us, inspires us, and motivates us."

And there were more comprehensive texts: "I believe in the father, the epic creator of a carefully created universe that is his divine and unique idea. We see that he continually surprises us with the

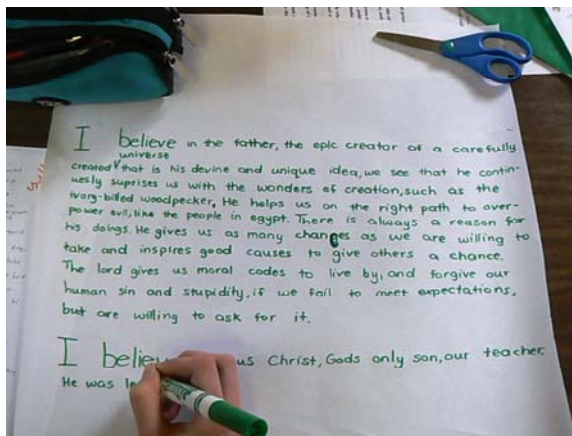
wonders of creation, such as the ivory-billed woodpecker. He helps us on the right path to overpower evil, like the people in Egypt. There is always a reason for his doings. He gives us as many chances as we are willing to take and inspires good causes to give others a chance.

"I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only son, our teacher. He was led to the cross like a lamb to the slaughter, but rose, showing us that there is hope. I believe in the Holy Spirit that brings us together. We cannot see it, but feel it every day. The Spirit welds us into one fellowship of the holy church that binds us in love as a global community.

Our impression actually was that the confirmands did not think the ancient Creed to be a burden or constraint, but to be a foundation and inspiration for their own faith. And this exactly is the purpose of the Creed.

The Creed which we profess in our weekly church service has been the symbol of the global Christian Community over many centuries. It summarizes what has been Christian Faith from the very beginnings. So many believers before us have trusted in these words. By these great words, we can feel supported and strengthened in our faith.

And then there are our personal formulations. Our own experiences will be relevant here, our reflections and observations will shape this personal creed – e.g. the Ivory Billed Woodpecker which helped one youth to rediscover the beauty and fragility of God's creation.



In Romans 10:9, Paul says, "if you confess with your lips that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved."

This exercise which we were trying with the confirmands, it can encourage each of us to say from our hearts, to say with our own words what faith means for us. So we could tell others what is so

helpful for us. So they could hear the message that transforms and saves lives.

Special Collection 2011

As in every year, the special collection is under way again. The aim of this special collection is, as you know, not only to collect money for the congregation, but also to expand the contact within the congregation and to foster an exchange of ideas. Of course, we are also very happy if you participate in celebrating our church services and remit your special donation during these church visits. A special donation envelope is enclosed. Regarding the new projects of the congregation, please also read the open letter of the President of the Church Council, Iris Schweiger.

Dear Members of the Martin Luther Church,

Warm greetings to all of you as we slowly approach the summer months. We are looking forward to an event-filled time in our congregational life and hope you will join us by participating in planned activities. It is also that time of year again where we ask for your kind consideration toward making a special contribution to our church finances.

As you may recall from our annual meeting, the Church Council addressed issues and expected new projects. The request for your support stems from the following plans:

1. The need to maintain sufficient operating income to cover general household expenses and costs during the generally more sparsely-attended summer months.
2. The expected partial renovation of our basement meeting room as a result of previous flooding damage and age. Currently, the project forecasts the retiling of the basement floor and upgrade of ceiling tiles during the first two weeks of July. Funds permitting, we hope to include a change in lighting as well. Total cost approx. \$16,000
3. The need to replace the flat roof at our 5 Superior building. While temporary fixes were undertaken last year as an interim measure by our maintenance committee; the roof is damaged, leaks in places and requires replacement. Total expected costs approx. \$11,000 also planned for July.
4. The exterior foundation of the church particularly front left and rear right requires upgrades due to some disintegrating stonework / masonry. The degree of repair depends on the extent of the problems discovered during excavation. Interim preliminary costs projected at \$18,000. Potential upgrades in the September / October timeframe.

Our budget, presented in February, had included these figures and happily we have managed to collect about 20% of the total required. This includes a grant by the EKD in Germany (about \$11,000), a contribution from our Day Care and a private donation. In addition, a letter has been presented to the City of Toronto for water damages sustained in 2009 and 2010 and we hope to be reimbursed for expenses incurred.

Nevertheless, in order to realize these plans this year your kind support is requested and we would greatly appreciate your consideration. As in previous years, any donation may be marked as "Special Collection / New Projects" or "Sondersammlung / Bauvorhaben".

Furthermore, should you have contacts with the trades or can recommend contractors with preferred rates for non-profit institutions, (especially for our exterior plans), kindly contact the Church Council. Help is always encouraged and much appreciated! I will be accepting campers till the start of camp as long as there is space available and I have enough counselors to properly care for your child.

Date & Price:

SATURDAY July 23rd to FRIDAY July 29th.

Camper: \$288 Group rate: \$250/person (families with 3 or more, aged 8 and up).

Contact me for special Family and Senior rates. All prices quoted herewith are for the full week and contain all applicable taxes. Daily camp rates are also available for those who cannot stay the week.

Bus rate is \$62/person or \$94/family, see more information below.

Important Forms required:

The registration form is required for *everyone* attending camp, including parents. The bus form is required if you are taking the bus to/from camp. Where payment for the above is required, please make a cheque payable to MLC.

Please sign the Multimedia Release Form, and attach with registration. This form lets us know if you consent to having your picture or video posted on our website or through other media. Failure to remit this form implies consent.

How you reach the Camp:

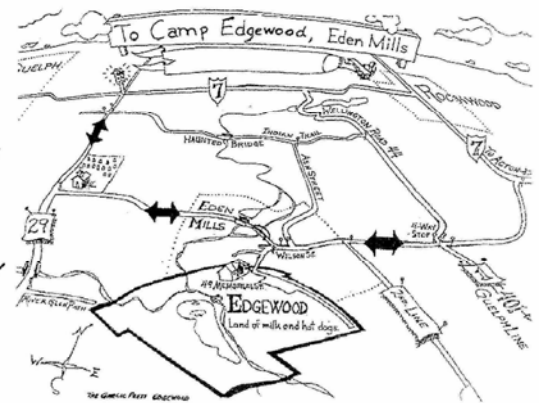
From Toronto:
